The annual Bela Schick Lectures is named in honor of one of medicine's most respected scientists. Dr. Bela Schick was born in Hungary and attended medical school in Austria. After serving as Extraordinary Professor of Children's Diseases at the University of Vienna, he immigrated to the United States in 1923. He was a pediatrician at Mt. Sinai in New York for many years, loved by his patients and respected by his fellows. Dr. Schick is best known for his work with Clemens von Pirquet on anaphylaxis and for the test he developed to assess immunity in diphtheria.



The landscape of food allergy management has evolved significantly, shifting from strict allergen avoidance to the introduction of targeted immunotherapies. Up until recently, there has been a lack of available therapeutic options for the management of food allergy. The recent approval of omalizumab, alongside earlier therapies, offers clinicians a range of options to manage IgE-mediated food allergies effectively. The integration of these new treatments into clinical practice requires an understanding of their benefits, risks, and appropriate application within a patient-centered care framework.

Omalizumab is a novel therapy approved for prevention of allergic reactions in patients with food allergies. How does it compare to traditional (current) therapies? This session will address unanswered questions that remain: Which patients can benefit most from omalizumab compared to other treatments? What are the dosing considerations and how do they change as a patient's weight increases? Should patients on omalizumab undergo a food challenge to "prove" efficacy of the treatment as compared to other therapies?
