Continuing the College's growth in 2026

2025-26 ACAAI President identifies challenges and opportunities facing ACAAI in the coming year.

I am honored to have been selected to serve as the 2025-26 President of the American College of Allergy, Asthma & Immunology. It is a pivotal time for medicine and our specialty, with many changes, challenges and opportunities, and I look forward to leading us through them in the coming year.

I'm also proud to be part of a unique moment in allergy/immunology leadership history. Black women are leading the two national allergy/immunology organizations – I will be the 2025-26 ACAAI President, and Dr. Carla M. Davis is currently President of the American Academy of Allergy, Asthma & Immunology. This is a prime opportunity to lend perspective to many aspects of growing the allergy workforce and continue to meet the diverse needs of our members and patients.

One of the challenges and opportunities currently facing allergy/immunology is the need to draw more physicians into our specialty. We

know our careers are rewarding, and we must communicate the personal and professional value of being an allergist/immunologist. I support the College's efforts to approach this challenge with unique programs.

The Pathways to Practice (P2P) program, launched by outgoing ACAAI President James M. Tracy, DO, FAAAAI, is a valuable initiative that will help address the growing shortage of practicing allergists in the United States. The program supports the training of 16 allergy/immunology fellows through grants awarded annually. The first P2P Fellows were recently named.

The College's **SPARK Award** program was started in 2017 and continues to thrive. The goal is to ignite an interest in medical residents to consider a career in allergy/immunology by providing scholarships to the ACAAI Annual Scientific Meeting. Each year, about 20 SPARK award recipients are mentored by allergy Fellows-in-Training and

interact with training directors and other allergists. One facet of the SPARK Award program is to reach out to historically Black medical colleges and universities to ignite the interest of Black medical students in our specialty.

Collaboration is key. Working together – either among College members or with organizational partnerships – is vital to move our goals forward.

The **Community and Academic Partnership in Education (CA²PER)**, introduced by 2023-24 College President Gailen D. Marshall, Jr., MD, FAAAAI, brings academic and community allergists together to conduct practice-based translational research. The first grantees were selected last spring, and we look forward to hearing about their research.

The **Community Allergists Partnership in Education (CAPE)** program, initiated by 2022-23 College President Kathleen R. May, MD, FAAAAI, is a partnership between community allergists and academia for opportunities for medical students,






residents or fellowships to learn in real-world clinical settings.

I can't say enough about the importance of advocacy for issues affecting practicing allergists and our patients. The **ACAAI Advocacy Council** takes on issues at the local, state and national levels. Members of the Advocacy Council travel to Washington, DC, every year to speak directly to congressional members and their staff. I've been a part of these Strike Force visits, and our face-to-face meetings are vital to bringing attention to our priorities.

We also take part in the Allergy and Asthma Network's Day on Capitol Hill to shine a light on important issues to make care more affordable and accessible to our patients. The ongoing Payer Education Campaign is addressing the alarming trend of insurance companies implementing unreasonable requirements for approving immunotherapy for our patients.

Other important programs will continue for our members and patient care.

The annual **Leadership Summit** is an opportunity for young aspiring leaders to gain communication and leadership skills to benefit them personally and professionally. Quite a few participants in the summit have assumed meaningful roles in the College.

The College's online **Racial Disparities and Health Equity Resource Center** features relevant information and data to help health care professionals reduce disparities in the quality of care for allergy/immunology patients.

I'm looking forward to continuing the programs and projects above and finding new opportunities to advocate for, educate, inspire and involve College members in the next year. ●


