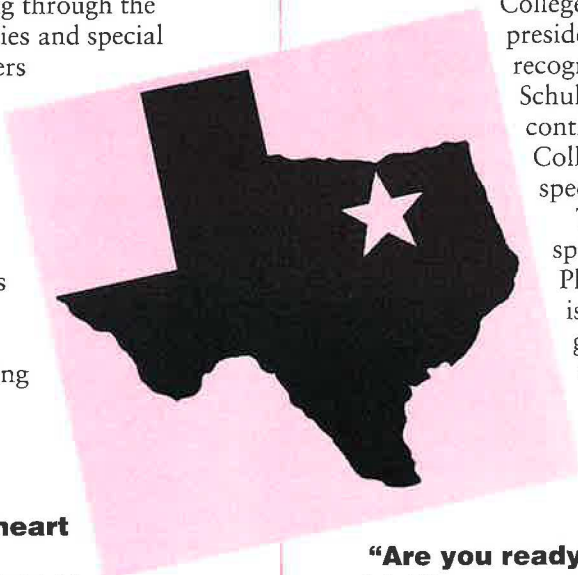
## Combining culture and education
