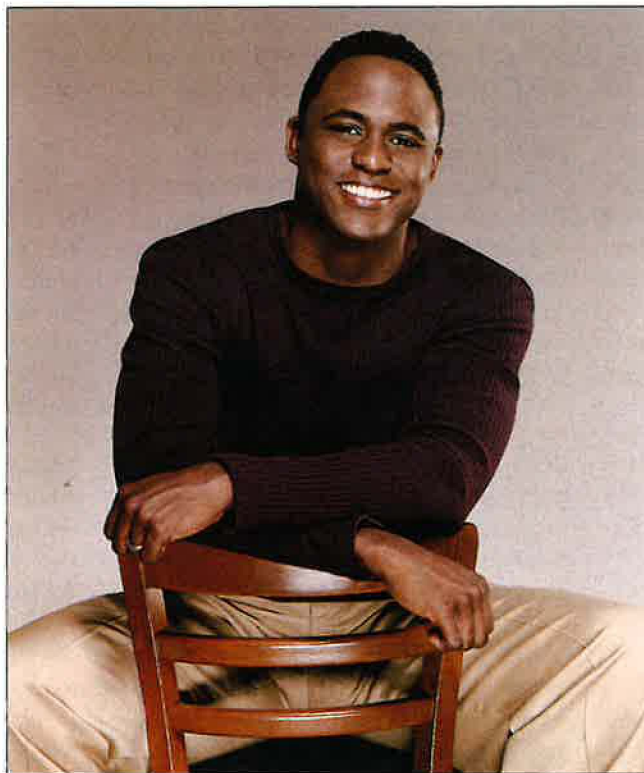
Popular comedian/entertainer Wayne Brady headlines 2003 Fundraising Dinner in New Orleans

Enjoy the hilarious improvisational antics and impersonations of Emmy Award winner Wayne Brady at the ACAAI Annual Fundraising Dinner, Sunday evening, Nov. 9, in New Orleans.

Among the funniest comedic actors on TV, Wayne is well known for his singing, dancing and impersonations on ABC's hit comedy series "Whose Line is it Anyway?"

In May, Wayne hosted the 30th Annual Daytime Emmy Awards and won two awards himself, including "Outstanding Talk Show" and "Outstanding Talk Show Host" for his day time talk program, the "The Wayne Brady Show." This engaging and surprising hour of entertainment begins its second season this fall, combining celebrity chat, music, comedy, human interest and audience participation.

An Orlando native, Wayne immersed himself in Central Florida theater community, and later moved to Los Angeles



and performed at the prestigious Mark Taper Forum. He was a series regular on the syndicated sketch comedy show "Kwik Witz" for two seasons, hosted the VH-1 comedy series, "Vinyl Justice," and made guest appearances on "Home

Court," "I'll Fly Away," and "In the Heat of the Night."

Fast on his way to becoming one of the most popular entertainers, he continues to tour the country with his own improv show, "Wayne Brady and Friends," selling out top theaters and venues.

The fundraising program includes a reception, dinner and performance. Net proceeds from the event will be donated to the ACAAI Foundation to support asthma camps for inner-city children, fellow-in-training research grants and clinical fellowship stipends in allergy and immunology.
